1. **St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City**
St. Peter's is the most renowned work of Renaissance architecture and the largest church in the world. St. Peter's is regarded as one of the holiest Catholic shrines. Catholic tradition holds that the basilica is the burial site of Saint Peter, chief among Jesus's apostles and also the first Bishop of Rome.

The **Zócalo** (Spanish pronunciation: ['so.ka.lo]) is the common name of the main square in central Mexico City. Prior to the colonial period, it was the main ceremonial center of the Aztec city of Tenochtitlan.

3. Grand Place in Brussels, Belgium

The **Grand Place** ("Grand Square" also used in English) is the central square of Brussels. It is surrounded by



opulent guildhalls and two larger edifices, the city's Town Hall, and the *King's House* or *Breadhouse* (French: *Maison du Roi*, Dutch: *Broodhuis*) building containing the Museum of the City of Brussels. Every two years in August, an enormous *flower carpet* is set up in the Grand Place for a few days. A million colorful begonias are set up in patterns, and the display covers a full 24 by 77 meters (79 by 253 ft), for area total of $1,800 \text{ m}^2$ (19,000 sq ft).

4. Tiananmen Square in Beijing, China

Tiananmen Square or **Tian'anmen Square** is a city square in the centre of Beijing, China, named after the Tiananmen ("Gate of Heavenly Peace") located to its north, separating it from the Forbidden City. The square contains the Monument to the People's Heroes, the Great Hall of the People, the National



Museum of China, and the Mausoleum of Mao Zedong. In 1989, it was the scene of student protests, which the Chinese government put down militarily.
